Professor Oidov Baatarkhuu graduated from the Mongolian National Medical University. He has received his PhD degree at the Postgraduate School, Health Sciences University of Mongolia in 2006. He is currently Professor of Medicine, Dean, School of Medicine, Mongolian National University of Medical Sciences and General Expert on Infectious Diseases of Ministry of Health, Mongolia.

He has completed his postdoctoral Fellowship in Hepatology at the Department of Internal Medicine, Severance Hospital, Yonsei University College of Medicine, Seoul, Korea between 2007-2008. He did second overseas Clinical Research Fellowship in Hepatology at the Department of Internal Medicine III, AKH Hospital, University of Vienna, Austria in 2012. Also currently he has completed as a Clinical Research Fellow in Hepatology at the Storr Liver Center, Westmead Millennium Institute for Medical Research, University of Sydney, Australia.

He has also been Visiting Professors at the Victorian Infectious Diseases Laboratory, Melbourne, Australia in 2014, Department of Internal Medicine, Yonsei University College of Medicine, Seoul, Korea in 2018 and Department of Internal Medicine, Cumming School of Medicine, Calgary University, Calgary, Canada in 2019.

Professor O. Baatarkhuu is past an Executive Council Member of APASL, Member of CEVHAP, and President of the Mongolian Association for the Study of the Liver Diseases, Executive Director of the Mongolian Infectious Diseases Physicians, and Chairman of the Scientific Committee for the APASL-STC 2012 in Mongolia and President for the APASL-STC 2017 in Mongolia.

He is a key investigator in more than 30 international and national trials on antiviral treatment of chronic hepatitis B, C and HCC. He has been extensively involved in research in the fields of viral hepatitis and hepatocellular carcinoma and he is currently working on the natural history of hepatitis B and D in Mongolia.

Professor O. Baatarkhuu has published more than 150 international and local papers. He also has spoken nationally and internationally on viral hepatitis and chronic liver diseases including hepatocellular carcinoma.

Professor Chen was appointed Director of the Hepatitis Research Center at the National Taiwan University Hospital in Taipei in 2001-2003, and now the faculty for Graduate Institute of Clinical Medicine, National Taiwan University. He was the President of Taiwan Association for Study of the Liver (TASL) from 2012 to 2013. He served as the President of Taiwan Society of Virology from 2016-2018.

His research interests focus on the molecular virology and immunology of hepatitis viruses, and the genetic and genomic study of hepatocellular carcinoma. Professor Chen's clinical research covers the natural history of chronic viral hepatitis and hepatocellular carcinoma, and also explores and conducts new therapies and trials for both diseases. He has published over 630 articles in the areas of hepatitis and hepatocellular carcinoma.

He serves in the Editorial Board of Gastroenterology between 2017-2019. From 2001 to 2006 and then 2010-2011, was a member of the editorial board of the journal *Hepatology* and is reappointed from 2019-2021. In 2000, Professor Chen was awarded the International Research Scholar in Infectious Diseases by the Howard Hughes Medical Institute for a period of five years. He has been elected into Academia Sinica in year 2006, and become the TAWS member in year 2011.

Professor Massimo Colombo is Director of the Liver Center at San Raffaele Hospital, Milan, Italy and Chairman of EASL International Liver Foundation, Geneva, Switzerland. In the past 3 years he has been Director of the Center of Translational Research in Hepatology at Humanitas Hospital, Milan, Italy and in the previous 15 years, he has been Chairman of the Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology and Chairman of the Department of Medicine and Liver, Kidney, Lung, Bone Marrow and Organ Transplantation at IRCCS Maggiore Hospital in Milan, Italy. He has also been a Professor of Medicine and Gastroenterology at the University of Milan for more than 25 years. Professor Colombo gained his medical degree from the University of Milan, before completing a residency in gastroenterology at IRCCS Maggiore Hospital. Subsequently he undertook an international fellowship in liver diseases at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York, USA (1974-1975), before returning to IRCCS Maggiore Hospital.

Professor Colombo's research interests include the diagnosis and treatment of viral hepatitis and liver cancer. A member of many professional societies including EASL, AASLD and several Italian societies, he is the recipient of numerous awards including the 2010 European Association Study Liver (EASL) Recognition Award for outstanding medical and scientific contributions, the Italian Association for the Study of the Liver (AISF) Distinguished Service Award, the Thannhauser Medal Award of the German Society of Gastroenterology and the Nelson Fausto Award of the International Liver Cancer Association(ILCA). Professor Colombo was Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Hepatology from 2005–2009 and currently sits of the editorial boards of many hepatology journals, is Special Section Editor of Journal of Hepatology(2015-2019), Strategic Advisor of Editor of Liver International(2015-2019) and contributor of Selected Summary for Gastroenterology(2000-2021). He was Associate Editor of Journal of Hepatology in 1996-2000 and chaired the writing committees of EASL Clinical Practice Guidelines of Benign Liver Tumors in 2014 and of Occupational Liver Diseases in 2017. In September 2016 he was appointed Chairman of EASL International Liver Foundation (Geneva, Switzerland). He has authored more than 500 original manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals, with an H-index of 104(Google Scholar) and 57,369 citations.





A. Personal Statement

My research over the last 30 years has focused on viruses; the molecular mechanisms of virus-host interactions, and pathogenesis. I focused on hepatitis C virus (HCV) as a major research area for the last several years. My laboratory was the first to report the pleotropic functions and oncogenic potential of HCV core protein. I have worked on various aspects of basic research funded by the NIH, and I participated in several ancillary studies on multicenter initiated projects including: The Hepatitis C Antiviral Long-term Treatment against Cirrhosis (HALT-C, funded by NIDDK), and Vaccine Development studies (funded by NIAID). I was one of the Principal Investigators of a U54AI057160 grant with the Midwest Regional Center of Excellence (MRCE) for Biodefense and Emerging Infectious Diseases Research. My study with the MRCE focused on HCV escape mechanisms from innate immunity and have shed light on the regulatory role on human complement related proteins. Our study from chronically HCV infected patients indicated that some complement components are significantly altered irrespective of the stage of liver disease. Interestingly, some of the complement status are repaired after HCV treatment, but not C5a, C5b-9 or Factor H. The results will offer an attractive approach to hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC) related therapy.
